Course description:

The purpose of the course is to introduce you to the theories and methods of psychology to lay the groundwork for more specialized courses that you will be taking in your studies. The topics of this semester are intelligence, development, emotion, motivation, personality, social psychology, psychological disorders and therapies.

Course requirements:

Exam. There will be two midterms and a final examination (total 60 %). The exams will be closed book and may include short-essay questions. The exams are based on the readings, and the material presented in class, including lectures, discussions, handouts, demonstrations, and audio-visual materials. Of the two midterms, the one with the lower grade will be dropped from the calculation of your final grade. In case you miss one of the midterms due to a <u>documented</u> emergency, your exam grade will be based on the other midterm plus the final exam. Missing two or more exams will result in an F grade.

Quizzes. There will be pop quizzes which will account for 10% of your final grade. There <u>cannot</u> be any make-up for pop quizzes.

Study presentation. In groups of 4, you are asked to select a chapter from Hock, R. R. (2013). *Forty studies that changed psychology*. UK: Pearson. A chapter can be selected by <u>at</u> <u>most</u> two groups. If two groups choose the same chapter, the particular readings to be presented <u>cannot</u> be the same.

The book is on the reserve of the library. Pick one or two the readings from your selected chapter. You will find the photocopy of the table of contents within the book. Please mark the chapter and the particular readings your group have selected on that photocopy-<u>not on the book itself</u>. Also write down the names of all the people in your group underneath the readings you have selected.

For the presentation, find the original article(s) that the reading(s) is referring to, and give a presentation to class (30-35 min.s presentation, 15 mins Q & A). The presentation should summarize the content of the reading(s) as well as any pertinent information from the original

article(s). The presentation can also include real life applications of concepts, discussions, videos, demonstrations etc.

The first presentation will start on 22nd of January. Study presentation will account for 30 % of your final grade.

Please note that your contribution to the group work will be rated by your teammates. If, for instance, your group receives the full %30 percent, but your contribution is determined to be 80%, you will receive %24 (30 x .80) from the study presentation

Bonus activity. In groups of 4, you can earn <u>up to</u> 15% bonus by creating a short video (~ 3 mins) about persuasion, or conformity and obedience. The video will be graded for accuracy, originality, and clarity. It will be graded out of <u>10 points</u> and will be added to your final grade. The deadline for submitting the link to your finished video to psych102tobb@gmail.com is <u>March, 16th</u>. The group with the best video will receive an additional 5 points. You are strongly encouraged to submit your video to http://nobaproject.com/student-video-award.

Reading assignments. You are expected to read the material assigned before coming to class.

Attendance. Although attendance will not "affect" your grade in terms of points, coming to class has an indirect and strong effect on how well most students do in the course.

Grading:

You must complete all course requirements in order to pass this course. The course as a whole will be graded according to the <u>Lisans Eğitim Öğretim ve Sınav Yönetmeliği</u> of TOBB ETÜ.
