Course Description

Social psychology is the scientific study individuals in social situations. The phenomena studied can be intrapersonal, personal, interpersonal or collective processes. As such, the theories and methods of social psychology attempts to provide explanation at multiple levels, and is considered a bridging discipline that brings together not only psychology subdisciplines but also neighboring disciplines such as economics, sociology, business administration, political science, law to name a few.

The purpose of the course is to introduce you to the fascinating world of social psychology. Some of the topics that you will be learning about are self, social cognition, attribution attitudes, social influence, relationships, prosocial and aggressive behavior, prejudice, and groups. In the end, the knowledge you have gained will help you hone your skills at critically analyzing the social world, and employing social psychological concepts in creative ways.

Course Requirements

Exam. There will be two midterms (25% each) and a final examination (40%). The exams will be closed book and may include short-essay questions. The exams are based on the readings, and the material presented in class, including lectures, discussions, handouts, demonstrations, and audio-visual materials. Of the two midterms, the one with the lower grade will be dropped from the calculation of your final grade. In case you miss one of the midterms due to a <u>documented</u> emergency, your exam grade will be based on the other midterm plus the final exam. Missing two or more exams will result in an F grade.

Quizzes. There will be pop quizzes which will account for 10% of your final grade. There <u>cannot</u> be any make-up for pop quizzes.

Poster assignment. This is a bonus assignment (10%). You can opt to prepare a poster presentation on a research topic you choose provided that the content is related with social psychology (deadline: Dec 1st). If you plan to complete the bonus assignment, you should consult me <u>within first month</u> of the semester, and thereafter provide a half page report detailing your progress with the assignment <u>every two weeks</u>. Failure to submit interim reports will result in no bonus even if the poster is complete.

Reading assignments. You are expected to read the material assigned before coming to class.

Attendance. Although attendance will not "affect" your grade in terms of points, coming to class has an indirect and strong effect on how well most students do in the course.
